(Pope Benedict XVI, Angelus February 1, 2009)

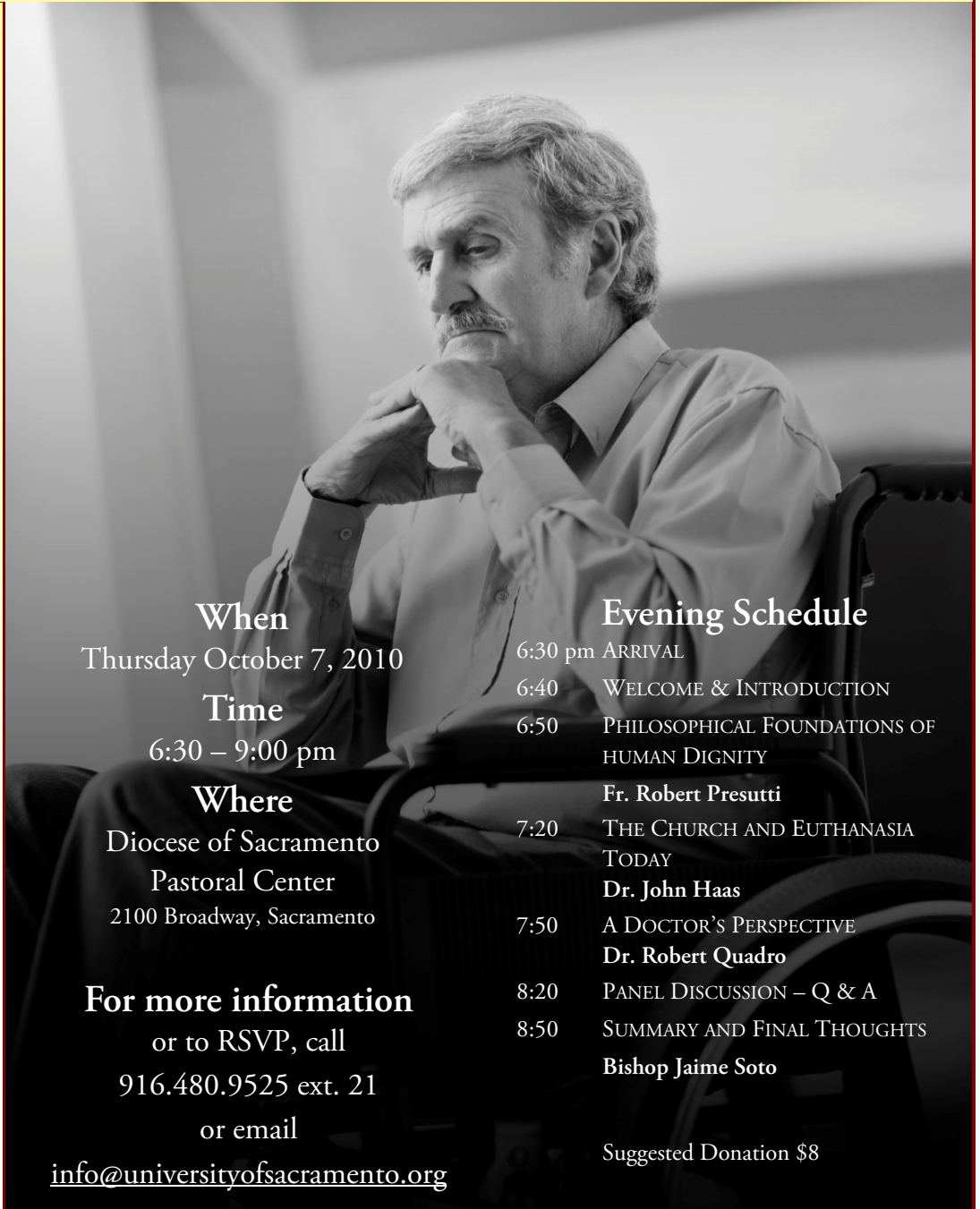
